Theatre Arts Department Syllabus

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All High School Theatre Curriculum focus on:

- > Enhancing perception, interpretation, and performance
- > Understanding influences of theatre, film, television, and technology
- > Reflecting and evaluating personal work and the work of others

In acting class you will be exposed to a wide range of dramatic literature and will develop fundamental acting skills. You will be given opportunities to stretch your imagination, focus your creative energies to bring characters to life.

- Students are involved and expected to participate in all exercises and performances.
- Students establish the conventions of time, history, style, and genre in a designated production and apply their interpretations to their own work.
- Students interpret the intent of the playwright that is to be communicated to the audience, read the directors' specifications, and correlate research and study to present a theatrical production.
- Students evaluate and critique each other's performance with constructive criticism no negative comments are allowed.
- Students develop self-discipline in learning all aspects of theatre.

In order to accomplish all of these objectives each student must be aware of the basic rules of this class:

<u>Theatre Arts Department:</u> <u>The Basic Rules</u>

- **<u>1.</u>** <u>Attendance</u>—You must be here for class. If you're not in my visual field when I take row and I can't hear you it means you're absent. Until you show up, you're absent.
- **<u>2.</u>** <u>Be ready to work</u>—Be organized; be prepared with your supplies which may include costumes and props and be focused on finishing the tasks at hand.
- **<u>3.</u>** <u>Tardiness</u>—Class begins when the bell rings. Be ready and in your seat or you will be marked tardy. Walking in as the bell rings = TARDY. Refer to student handbook regarding tardy procedures.
- **<u>4.</u>** <u>Late Work</u>—I do not accept late work for a grade. If you are absent the work is due on the day after you return. Refer to the student handbook for extended illnesses and test make-up policy.
- 5. <u>Special Assignments</u>— Performances are due for all students on the first day scheduled. If you are absent on the day prior to a performance, you will still be expected to perform on the assigned due date. Please do not procrastinate on long range assignments; plan ahead.
- 6. <u>Respect each other</u>—Respect the work, respect the process, and respect the teacher/director. Be supportive to your classmates—you'd be surprised how great it makes YOU feel, too!! ☺
- 7. <u>Keep the stage and drama rooms clean</u>—<u>No food, drinks, or gum!</u> Throw trash in the trash can. Don't leave personal items in the rooms. I like to keep clean rooms, so I will clean randomly and will throw away anything and everything.
- 8. Don't get foolish—No Horse playing in the shop, theatre room or auditorium!!! We will be around tools ranging from circular saws to jigsaws, wrenches and sewing needles. Foolish Students will be told to stop working and will get a zero for the project and the day.
- 9. <u>Script Subject Matter—</u>Students are expected to use reasonable discretion in writing scripts and planning scenes. Please use good judgment and these guidelines: No profanity or suggestive business in rehearsal or performance. Seek teacher approval for any questionable language or business before it is used. Use of Violence will NOT be allowed at anytime during any rehearsal or performance.
- **<u>10.</u>** <u>Technology:</u> All technology is put away unless directed to be used. Usually this will mean referring to calendars, remind, or google classroom. All monologues and scripts and other class material will be physical and not on any device.

Raider Productions The Basic Expectations

- 1. <u>Practicum Hours:</u> Students will reach their <u>70 hours per semester</u> requirement as part of their final exam. <u>Practicum Hours will be checked at a half way</u> point of semester as a midterm exam. Half of the hours are expected to be reached by then.
- 2. <u>Productions:</u> Students will either audition as an actor or sign up for tech. Students are not forced to only do one role, but must be part of the productions.
- 3. <u>Scheduling:</u> Stage Managers and Director are in charge or scheduling rehearsal time on Theatre Calendar.
- 4. <u>Absents:</u> Students must let Stage Managers and Director know they will be out for a rehearsal, tardiness or unexcused absence from rehearsal will be considered a Demerit.
- 5. <u>Demerits:</u> Students who reach a <u>3 Demerit limit</u> will be put on trial and listed on the blacklist. Directors, Stage Managers, and Officers will keep track of Demerits.
- 6. <u>Blacklist:</u> Status_will be considered for removal at the end of the school year by Director. Blacklist Status removes student's ability to audition for productions, participate in production activities, and students will work on research papers to substitute practicum hours.
- 7. <u>UIL:</u> Students will <u>Audition</u> for competition. Even if students have not made the team, they will <u>still work on the production</u>.
- 8. <u>Scripts:</u> Actors will follow dates on when to be off book, and due dates. Failure to do so will result in <u>demerits</u>, and <u>failure on a test grade</u>.
- 9. <u>Technology:</u> Stage Managers will keep track of devices during rehearsals for any important/emergency notifications. No devices during rehearsals, actors and tech.
- 10. <u>Be on Time:</u> Early is On Time, On Time is Late, and Late is Failing.
- 11. <u>Rehearsals:</u> Are Grades, not showing up to rehearsal means you miss out on a grade.

<u>Tech:</u> Not reporting your progress at the end of the period means you miss out on a grade.

Speak to Director and Stage Managers to report your progress on assignments. If you do not have an assignment ask for one, I may have skipped over you by mistake, does not excuse you to do nothing.

Rehearsal: Daily Grade (points will vary depending on rehearsal schedule) Run Through Rehearsal: Test Grade

Tech Days: Test Grades

Performance Days are Semester Finals

Grade Overview

- 1. An "A" grade (90 100) indicates exceedingly high quality work. This requires mastery of all assigned work, showing originality and initiative, doing more than required, and making quality contributions in class.
- 2. A "B" grade (80 89) indicates good progress that is above average. This requires mastering portions of all assigned work, showing alertness and interest in the work required, completing work on time, and consistently participating in class.
- 3. A "C" grade (70 79) indicates a quality of work acceptable for this Theatre class. This requires satisfactorily completing most assigned work under normal conditions and directions, showing interest in the work required, and completing work on time.
- 4. A "Below 70" grade indicates a need for greater effort to meet requirements of this course satisfactorily. This type of grade indicates achievement below Theatre standards, completing a minimum amount of assigned work, and seldom responding in class.
